Subject	Unit	I can statements	How you can help at home
Reading	Narrative Nonfiction	I can answer questions about a narrative nonfiction.	Have your child read nonfiction books. Ask them what its about. Specifically, go to a chapter and ask, "What is the main idea of this chapter?" And ask for details to support the main idea.
Writing	Argument/ Opinion	I can form an opinion and give reasons to back up my opinion.	When talking to your child about their opinion on things, ask them to give actual reasons. Ex: I think the Pittsburgh Steelers are the best because they have won 6 Superbowl's.
On Math	Order of Operations	I can solve problems in the correct order.	<ul> <li>Review multiplication and division with your child. Simple math fact fluency.</li> <li>Ex: 6x7 72 divided by 9</li> </ul>
Adv. Math	Geometry	I can classify polygons by their attributes.	<ul> <li>Talk about different types of polygons other than squares, rectangles, trapezoid.</li> <li>Have them point out different angels of doors and use parallel and perpendicular</li> </ul>
Acc. Math	Adding and Subtracting Decimals	I can add and subtract decimals.	<ul> <li>Add up receipts from the grocery store</li> <li>Estimate amounts to help check if answers are reasonable</li> </ul>
Social Studies	Turn of the century	I can discuss important events, people, and inventions from the turn of the century.	<ul> <li>Ask about the people, events, and inventions discussed in class. (Teddy Roosevelt, Cattle Drive, etc.)</li> </ul>
